Next meeting is January 18th, 2022, at 7:00 p.m.



But a Ford Motor Company executive was nearby. He talked to the guard. He spoke with a White House presidential aide. And he said to Frances Green, "Come back here tomorrow at 9 a.m."

The next day was anything but calm at the White House. A lot was going on. But Frances Green showed up at nine o'clock, full of expectation and enthusiasm. She was met by the car company official, who gave her a wonderful tour of the White House. As they were going by the Oval Office, President Reagan glanced out and saw

Frances Green. He gestured her into his office.

As she entered, he rose from his desk and called out, "Frances! Those lousy computers, they messed up again! If I'd known you were coming, I would have come out there to get you myself." He then invited her to sit down, and they talked leisurely about California, her town, her life and family.

The president of the United States gave Frances Green a lot of time that day — more time than he had. He knew this woman had nothing to give him, but she needed something he could give her.

And so the Ford executive and the president took time to be kind and compassionate.

In the same manner, God of all creation—there is no higher-ranking authority—will do the same for you. God beckons you to have a meeting, a conversation, a chat—to come into his presence with rejoicing.
