Where long ago you used to be And never turn aside;



May 15th is Teachers' Day in Mexico. *Dia del Maestro* is celebrated across Mexico as a special day when educators are honored and praised. Teachers, teachers' aides and staff are treated to gifts of presents, cards, poetry and artwork. Choirs and theater productions laud teachers, showing their appreciation in the performances they offer. Some schools or universities might throw parties, or host dinners in honor of the teachers, instructors and professors of the institution. It's a great idea. Although it is not a federal holiday, it

is an official observance and very popular. In my conversations with former high school classmates, I discovered that without exception we all remember at least one remarkable teacher who inspired us with her or his knowledge of the subject matter or creative way in which it was taught. The Bible honors and respects good and honest teachers. The role of teachers is so important that Scripture counsels that not everyone should aspire to be a teacher (see James 3:1). The book of Proverbs commends those who have the wisdom to listen to their teachers. Perhaps the greatest lesson we can learn from teachers is to never stop learning! Education is a lifelong enterprise which, if successful, is never completed! I know that is a paradox. But then the truly educated realize that the more you learn, the more you comprehend how much you don't yet know or understand. Most of us are of an age when we're not young enough to have all the answers. But we're probably old enough to know that we could have avoided some lessons from the school of hard knocks and the university of experience had we been more attentive to the greatest source of knowledge called the Bible.

Those who understand that wisdom comes from the Lord are wise indeed!
